Key Vocabulary

Knowledge Building Blocks

- Christians believe that:
- Jesus is God and that he was born as a baby in Bethlehem.
- The Bible points out that his birth showed that he was extraordinary (for example, he is worshipped as a king, in Matthew) and that he came to bring good news (for example, to the poor, in Luke).
- They should celebrate Jesus' birth; Advent for Christians is a time of getting ready for Jesus' coming.
- Mary and Joseph were told to call their child 'Jesus', meaning 'he saves' or 'saving one'.
- Mary is herself a model of selfless 'helping'.
- Christians celebrate the coming of God's Son to rescue people, and to model the need for humans to help others.



Key Bible Stories

Luke 1:26-38 and 2:1-20

- Mary is visited by the Angel Gabriel who tells her that she is to have a baby who is the Son of God
- Joseph is engaged to Mary and they travel to Bethlehem to be registered
- Mary and Joseph stay in a stable as all the inns are full
- Mary has her baby in the stable
- Angels appear to shepherds to tell them to go to Bethlehem
- Shepherds visit the baby

Christians try to help others, and want to care for others, and it is not only Christians who celebrate Christmas. It is only Christians who believe Jesus is God in the flesh.

- Jesus is crucified
- He says the words 'Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.' before he died
- Jesus was placed in a tomb

Luke 24

- The women go to visit the tomb and find the stone rolled away. Angels tell them that Jesus will rise again
- Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene and the disciples


Who is Muslim and what do they believe?



Key Vocabulary

Knowledge Building Blocks

- In the Muslim faith, God is called Allah, but has 99 other names
- The Prophet Muhammad was given guidance for living by Allah, this is written in the Qur'an
- Muslims say "Peace be upon him" every time they mention the Prophet Mohammad's name, because he is so important
- Muslims pray five times every day, at certain times. They face to the east when they pray, in the direction of the holy city of Mecca
- Ramadan and Eid-ul-Fitr are special Muslim celebrations. During Ramadan Muslims fast during hours of daylight and can only eat when it is dark.



Key Stories

Muhammad and the Cat:

- Muhammad notices a cat is sitting on his cloak.
- Not wanting to disturb the cat when he gets up, he cuts the part of the cloak that the cat was sitting on and goes on his way.

The Crying Camel:

- Muhammad comes across a camel who is crying. The camel is tied up and was thirsty.
- Mohammad feels sorry for the camel and then becomes angry, wanting to know who the camel belongs to.
- On finding the owner, Mohammad explains that the camel is one of Allah's creatures
